








What Percent of our Income Funds these Programs?




Taxes as Percent of Personal Income, 2011



Mass. Taxes are About Average, 2011


State and local taxes as % of state personal income







MA Taxes Among Largest Declines: 1977-2011


Percent change in state and local taxes as % of state personal income

Note: North Dakota (35.5%) and Alaska (21.6%) exceed the scale of this graph.

























Three income tax changes cost nearly \$3 billion per year






Tax Cuts Have Affected Services





Billions, Inflation Adjusted














No Clear Relationship Between Tax Levels & Wages, 2012



State & Local Taxes as a Share of State Personal Income




Strong Relationship Between Education and Wages, 2012

Weak Relationship Between Education and Wages 30 Years Ago, 1979




Percent of Workforce with Bachelor's Degree
